

Old Issues of IEEE Transactions on Consumer Electronics—Donated to IEEE History Center

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IEEE Transaction on Consumer Electronics

1. The first consumer electronics transactions were done by the *Professional Group on Broadcast and Television Receivers*.
2. First Issue: PGBTR-1, July 1952.
3. During the period 1952–1954, the issues were numbered consecutively (not by year or volume number).
 - a. The last PGBTR was PGBTR-8, dated October 1954.
4. The *Transactions on Broadcast and Television Receivers* (the first time yearly/volume numbers were used) began in 1955 with issue BTR-1.
5. The use of the IEEE nomenclature (rather than the IRE) began in 1963.
6. The use of color covers (rather than black & white) began in July 1966.
7. There is an *Indexing Issue* included: BTR-12-5, December 1966 (Index for years 1955 through 1965).
8. All issues, beginning with PGBTR-1 and ending with BTR-20, #4, have been shipped to the IEEE History Center.
9. The collection also includes a publication entitled: *Compilation of IEEE Standards on Broadcast and Television Receivers*.
 - a. It is marked “1947” – but this must be a mistake because a 1961 standard is contained in that publication.

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
