In the last few years, we were fortunate to add another talented part-time staffer, focused primarily on our electronic outreach: web, social media, email. Last year the AdCom let me stand up an AdHoc Committee to study our staff needs relative to both operational and strategic issues. After a careful and detailed analysis that included input from all of the CIS Vice Presidents, AdCom approved a motion to search for an Executive Director for the Society. Early this year, a search committee was formed that ultimately hired **Tom Compton** as the CIS Executive Director. Welcome to this new role, Tom. With respect to CIS members, Tom will

We'd like broad participation across CIS.
