He also assigns full-length articles to editorial board members who handle the review process.

Namrata Vaswani

Prof. Namrata Vaswani, from Iowa State University, has been selected as the new area editor for special issues. Prof. Vaswani is an expert in statistical machine

learning, computer vision, and data science in general. She also brings important connections as chair of the Women in Signal Processing Committee and as a member of the IEEE Signal Processing Society (SPS) Data Science Initiative. The area editor for special issues shepherds special issue proposals through the editorial board's review and feedback process. She also spends time coming up with about topics for new clusters and special issues and encouraging organizers to submit manuscripts on those topics.

#### Columns and forum



Roberto Togneri

Prof. Roberto Togneri, from The University of Western Australia, is the new area editor for columns and forum. Prof. Togneri has broad experience in several

areas including speech, machine learning, and biometrics. He was an associate editor of *SPM*'s "Lecture Notes" column for four years. In *SPM*, columns include articles that address topics of general interest including news, applications, education, advice, and perspectives. A forum is a venue for discussion among

several experts, often with competing points of view. Different from other editing positions, the area editor and associate editors in the columns and forum work more closely with the authors on the text and layout of each article.

#### e-Newsletter



Ervin Sejdic

The area editor for *Inside Signal Processing e-Newsletter* is Ervin Sejdic, from the University of Pittsburgh. Prof. Sejdic has experience in biosignal

processing, biometrics, rehabilitation engineering, and advanced information systems in medicine. Prof. Sejdic started in this role in mid-2017. The area editor for the e-Newsletter coordinates all newsletter content including Society and technical committee news, confirmation information, research activities, local Chapter information, and information about programs related to signal processing.

## Social media and outreach

Tiago Henrique Falk, from Institut National de la Recherche Scientifique, Montréal, Canada, joins us as the new area editor for social media and outreach.

Prof. Falk works in the area of speech and brain-computer interfaces and also has a background in speech and language processing as well as multimedia processing. Of particular interest, Prof. Falk makes good use of social media already including Twitter and YouTube for his lab's activities. This position is relatively new, and the exact role is still evolving. At this point, we see this area editor promoting *SPM*'s content in different forms of social media; we welcome suggestions from SPS membership on how to best use this form of communication.

Finally, I am happy to introduce the area editor for special initiatives, Prof. Andres Kwasinski, from the Rochester Institute of Technology. Prof. Kwa-

sinski works in multimedia wireless communication, cognitive radio, joint source-channel coding, and cooperative networks. He has extensive experience with *SPM* including serving as the area editor of columns and forum and also social media and outreach. Prof.

Kwasinksi's first special initiative will be to help build a set of guidebooks that document the activities of the area editors and the EIC for *SPM*.


