It is our great honor to host the Fourth Workshop on Hyperspectral Image and Signal Processing - Evolution in Remote Sensing (WHISPERS) in Shanghai, China on June 4-7, 2012, after its first three successful editions in Genoble, France; Reykjavik, Iceland; and Lisbon, Portugal.

Hyperspectral remote sensing, also known as imaging spectrometry, has emerged in the middle of 1980s. Keeping up with the international pace, China has made significant progress in this

promising field. During the last ten years, in addition to the technical developments, the applications of hyperspectral imaging in various areas have also been actively conducted in China. Thus, we are very excited to have WHISPERS in China, offering a prestigious but convenient forum for domestic researchers to share their most recent research outcomes with international peers; meanwhile, international experts can have this great opportunity to know more about hyperspectral research status in China, and explore the possible collaboration opportunity in the future.

of all the papers was performed based on the reports of anonymous reviewers. On average, each paper is judged by 2.5 reviews. WHISPERS 2012 received the continued technical sponsorship of the IEEE Geoscience and Remote Sensing Society (GRSS).

We would like to take this opportunity to give a special thank to the founding father of WHISPERS, Jocelyn Chanussot, who has made the brave decision: move WHISPERS to China to further expand its impact in Asia.
