## **OVERVIEW**

With the publishing of the report of the Health, Education and Welfare Secretary's Committee, "Records, Computers

and Rights of Citizens," on personal data systems the question of the individual's right to privacy and methods of securing this right have taken on even greater importance to the information processing committee. The panelists will attempt to define security and privacy and to draw the distinction which makes them both severable and related. In the past it has been a contention that security of systems is a panacea to the protection of privacy. It is the contention of some of the panelists that this is not necessarily the correct assumption.
