



The State of the Journal

It has been 3 years since I took over as the editor-in-chief of *ACM Transactions on Asian Language Information Processing (TALIP)*. I am pleased to say that I have recently been reappointed as its editor-in-chief for a second term.

During the past 3 years, TALIP has diligently stuck to its target of reviewing and publishing only articles related to Asian language information processing. The number of submissions has grown from 70 submissions in 2008 to 109 submissions in 2009 (inclusive of submissions to special issues), with an acceptance rate of 15% in 2009, which is one of the most competitive acceptance rates among all ACM journals and transactions. The average time to first decision in 2009 was 70 days, which is a respectable turnaround time.

These achievements are only possible due to the generous support of the authors, reviewers, and associate editors of TALIP.
